The second round of the NCEA Common Assessment Activities for our Years 10 and 11 students will occur in Week 9. In our last week of the term, our senior students will be running Spirit Week and the final Friday of the term will see the annual Matamata Cultural Exchange. When we return next term, our seniors will only have two-and-a-half weeks' before they break for study leave. During these two-and-a-half weeks we will have our Cultural Prizegiving, Sports Prizegiving and our Senior Academic Prizegiving.

Our fibre cable was damaged during the holidays and this has meant that phoning in to our Office has been impacted. Out of Zone Ballot for Term 3

Today at assembly, I talked to our students As we did last term, we are advising that there will be an enrolment period put in place for Term 3. This means that any students who wish to enrol and who live outside of our school zone will have to go on to a waiting list until a ballot is held at the end of the term. As we have already mentioned, our roll is currently at capacity purely through our in-zone enrolments. We do appreciate the confidence of our community that this shows in our school, but it does bring with it some challenges to meet the needs of all of our students.

Literacy Reading Co-Requisite results

Those who sat the co-requisite assessments (CAA's) in Weeks 4 and 5 of Term 2 can now access their Reading results from their NZQA account. They need to login to their accounts and check their results under the "My school entries and results" section. The Writing and Numeracy results will be released on 5 August. Students who receive Not Achieved for one or more literacy or numeracy standards will be able to download personalised reports highlighting where they did well and where they should focus future efforts from their accounts as well.

Piako Festival

In the last week of Term 2, a highly successful Piako Festival was reestablished and held at Morrinsville School. We want to acknowledge their efforts in hosting all of our schools in what was a wonderful event that showcased the talents of all of the kura in our area. Come along to the Arts Showcase being held in our Performing Arts Centre from Wednesday 7 through to Saturday 10 August, starting at 7pm. Tickets available from









