Next week (26 to 29 August) all of our senior students will be sitting their NCEA Practice Examinations. The timetable for the practice examinations has been emailed to all the students school email accounts. Students are required to see Ms Keightley in the school office if there are any examination clashes so that she can arrange an alternative time for them to sit their exams.

The NCEA Practice examinations are very important and should be taken seriously because it contributes towards the derived grades for external assessments. These grades will contribute towards the endof-year NCEA examination grades if students are unable to sit the examinations due to some unforeseen circumstances and they end up applying for a derived grade.

CAA Exams

These exams will mostly impact our Years 10 and 11 students who did not pass the Numeracy and Literacy exams in the first round earlier in the year. These will follow exactly the same rules as our NCEA practice exams and each student has already had a run through of what is required in the first round.
